MINUTES OF FIRST BUSINESS SESSION

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 am by Director and Regional Chairman (DRC) John Dugan. He welcomed everyone to the conference and made some program announcements.

Ottawa proposed Gemma Kerr as CRC Recording Secretary. This was seconded by Montreal and carried.

Attendees were asked to fill out the sign-up sheet. Total attendance including officers and visitors was 57.

DRC John Dugan briefly reviewed the CRC binder contents.

There were no changes to the meeting Agenda.

Montreal proposed and Hamilton seconded a motion to postpone discussion of the CRC'93 Minutes until the Second Business Session. This was carried.

Delegates summarised their Chapter's activities during the year. The full text of each Chapter Report can be found in the sections of the CRC binder indicated below:

Halifax (Section 11): a highlight was the golf tournament whose profits went to ASHRAE Research.

- Track students after graduation through their Alumni association
- For a good program
 - Select topics first, then look for speakers to fit
 - Get a complete list of themes/topics prepared by September
 - Have a short technical session before dinner, and a speaker afterwards
 - Ask out-of-town speakers to speak to different Chapters on successive nights
- Best use of PAOE
 - PAOE points can serve as a motivation for action, but Committee chairs need enthusiasm and commitment to be successful
 - A regional interim report will be established at mid-year, January 31

Historian (Section 9) Cliff Thompson reported as follows:

- Montréal had the highest PAOE points total
- · Compliments to Ottawa on their Historical Night
- Montréal and Ottawa were the only Chapters to provide reports. Points for other Chapters were deduced from newsletter entries. Reports should be provided by all Chapters next year
- · There were no Gold Ribbon awards this year
- · A history of Region II has been started

Educational Activities Vice Chair (Section 4) Tom McDonald reported as follows:

- · Montréal had won the Educational Activities award, with Ottawa close behind
- · The Region has four new student Chapters
- Congratulations to London on their HVAC course for members, and regret that there was no way of rewarding their efforts with points

London asked whether points would be available next year, and the Regional Chair requested that a motion on the subject be put forward at the Second Business Session.

Membership Promotion Vice Chair (Section 6) Norm Johnson reported as follows:

- Québec remains outstanding in Membership Promotion
- · Congratulations to Montréal on their large number of advancements
- · The Region came close to achieving Presidential goals of 3% growth and minimum delinquency of 6%
- Most Chapters now have two Membership Promotion Nights each year

TEGA Vice Chair (Section 5) Laurier Nichols reported as follows:

- Ottawa had the most PAOE points in 1994. If the report shows discrepancies with known Chapter submission, this is due to delays in recording
- · PAOE points are not a perfect evaluation tool. They do not adequately reward the efforts of small Chapters
- · There was a wide variety of programs. Chapters looking for ideas should check the report in the binder
- Last year's Technology Award winners did not succeed in gaining awards at Society level. However, the Montréal entry (Biodôme) will be resubmitted this year with changes
- All three entries for 1994 Technology Awards were submitted by Ottawa

The Regional Director congratulated the TEGA Vice Chair on his report.

Nominating Committee Member: Darryl Boyce reported as follows:

- John Bisset was elected Director at Large
- · John Dugan was elected DRC
- · Fall-back nominations will be made this year also
- Delegates should ensure in future that the candidates put forward at the upcoming meeting were properly qualified and willing to stand for election
- There is no report in the binder as Nominating Committee deliberations are confidential.

The meeting was adjourned for lunch at 11:52 am.

Refrigeration (Section 8) Tom Drennan reported as follows:

- Refrigeration seminars were presented in Toronto and Ottaw
- Québec worked hard but received no recognition. Hopefully

Research Promotion (Section 7) Dan Castellan reported as follow

- This was a record year for the Region. Receipts were up to
- To celebrate the Centennial, ASHRAE will present medallior
- New Brunswick/PEI, Québec, London and Windsor won Hgi
- The new "Full Circle Award", for Chapters all of whose officers by Ottawa
- Encourage Chapters to start their campaigns early to have :

The Chairman said that there was a new Chapter Operations Mahave one.

II.11 That ASHRAE hire a consultant with experience in organizational behaviour to analyze the current Chapter/Region structure and function, identify barriers to fulfilling the mission in an efficient, effective way, and recommend changes to streamline the organization: the motion was withdrawn because there was no seconder.

Ottawa tabled one motion as follows:

II.12 To increase region fund assessment from \$0.50 per dues paying member to \$1.00 per dues paying member effective July 1, 1996: this was seconded by Windsor and identified as a regional motion. It was passed 8-0-1-9.

The Regional Fund issue was resolved with passage of the Ottawa motion. The report can be found in Section 23 of the binder.

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Michel Vernier reported on the Education Workshop as follows:

- · Attended by six Chapter Education Chairmen and several visitors
- · Focus on K-12 program, looking at preparing a video
- Retain the \$32 Handbook price for students
- · There is concern over the membership loss as student members graduate
- Region II entrants needed for the student paper contest. Prizes are \$2500 and \$1500

Norm Johnson reported on the Membership Workshop as follows:

- · Attended by nine Chapter Membership Chairmen, two Chapters with two representatives each
- MBO requirements discussed, Chapter in Operations Manual reviewed
- · Chapter visits to include visits to larger employers who support Chapter members
- · Many Chapters are not going after bonus PAOE points

Laurier Nichols reported on the TEGA/Program Workshop as follows:

- Chapters were asked to make a list of good speakers for future use, and to supply this list to Raynald Courtemanche of Québec for preparation of a regional list
- Pre-dinner technical session and post-dinner speaker format found to work well
- Program Chairs reminded to submit the year's program to the RVC by the due date
- Technology Award criteria discussed. Entries need to be submitted by June 1, 1995
- Would like entries for Government Affairs Award in 1995 (there were none in 1994)

Dan Castellan reported on the Research Promotion Workshop as follows:

- Two workshops were held, but there still was not enough time
- Attendance by seven Chapter Research Promotion Chairman
- Fundraising techniques were discussed, including justification for raising money, selection of Chair and committee, methods of soliciting, dealing with contributors
- · Financial goals set by Society, but Chapters responsible for MBOs and action plan

Ness Lakdawala reported on the Refrigeration Workshop as follows:

- · Chapter Seminars covering new refrigerants and toxicity were varied and well attended
- Québec lost PAOE points last year because of lack of communication. Discussion of the PAOE system led to improved understanding. The new PAOE format was welcomed
- Arrangements were make for exchange of information on speakers
- · Request made for inclusion of a summary of CRC protocol next year to aid attendees

Paul Baker reported on the Historical Workshop as follows:

- · Seven Chapters were represented, six by the Historical Chairman
- On PAOE points, the good news is that par is easy to achieve, the bad news that unless a minimum of 200 is obtained, zero is awarded. Chapters should claim 100 points for mounting a Centennial display at CRC
- ASHRAE President Billy Manning indicated that a Society representative would attend Chapter Centennial celebration if given sufficient notice
- Each Chapter should obtain a copy of the new, enlarged Centennial videotape
- The Workshop supported the motion that the Historical Committee should be a grassroots committee
